We're Hiring! Full Time Youth Services Librarian

Purpose: To provide library services to children and teens. Duties include planning and conducting programs which would include programs for babies (ages 1yr to 2yr.), toddlers (3-4) and preschool (4-5). Also programs for children grades 1-5, Tweens grades 6-8, and Teens 9 and up. Other duties include helping children with reference questions, on computers, coordinating with schools and parents and long term planning for children and teen services with the Director.

Essential functions:

Programming:

Plan and conduct weekly children and teen programming

Plan and conduct a seven week summer reading program

Year round planning & preparation, Raising funds to meet expenses, Scheduling performers for Summer Reading programs, Promoting the program at the schools, Prepare and implement reading logs, activities and prizes, Plan and conduct an end of Summer Reading party, Have a goal of increasing number of participants and books read each year

Plans and/or conducts performers and other programs for children and teens throughout the year **Collection Development:**

Select books, videos, audio tapes and cd's for the Young Adult and Children's collections

Weed the Young Adult and Children's collections

Keep sections in order

Keep in touch with trends, fads and events that will effect collection development

Prepare handouts, displays, bulletin boards and other promotional materials

Educate children and teens in how to use the library's resources

Enforce library policies and procedures

Assist at circulation desk as back-up when needed

Other duties as assigned by the Director

Attend monthly staff meetings

Able to work night and weekends as needed

Education Minimum of a Bachelor's Degree in Childhood Education Prefer Masters Library and Information Science with specialty in Children's Services

Work Experience:

Minimum: Entry level-Consult with some experience of working with children and teens Prefer: At least one year experience working with groups of children

Tax Form Issues

Libraries across the country recently received very unfortunate news from the IRS. According to the text of their email "While we had committed to waiting until next year to making changes to the Tax Forms Outlet Program, the situation has changed. As you may be aware, IRS appropriations were significantly cut in the 2015 Omnibus Appropriations bill recently passed by Congress. Unfortunately this puts us in a position where we have very few options. We want to honor our commitment to you by providing some key products, but we cannot deliver nearly what we have in the past...Unfortunately, we are unable to offer Instructions for Forms 1040, 1040A and 1040EZ. Your patrons can obtain copies of Instructions through:IRS.gov/Forms - to view and download, IRS.gov/orderforms - to order tax products to be delivered by mail or 1-800-829-3676 - to order tax products to be delivered by mail."
